Traffic signs

Traffic signs and folding stands are used to state the rules of a temporary layout to the driver in words and symbols. The reflective face returns headlight to the driver; the folding stand fits the traffic sign and folding stand set into a van, set out by one person. They are portable, fast and readable. The stand takes ballast, staying upright and aligned on a windy site. Traffic signs and folding stands are used on road works, in temporary diversions, in event traffic and in emergency response.

TECHNICAL SUMMARY

Sign / stand size	49–250 cm
Stand type	Folding tripod · fixed foot · barricade body
Sign face	Reflective sheeting, printed to requirement
Substrate and thickness	Aluminium or galvanised sheet; material, thickness and edge/back stiffening are selected separately per specification — different procurement documents call for different materials and thicknesses, which are not one product's tolerance band
Delivery scope	Sign face only, or sign + post + clamp package; who is responsible for the foundation and support calculation is fixed in writing before the order

Values are production-programme and market-standard ranges; final dimensions are given in writing with the quotation.

WHERE IT IS USED

- Road works. At the start of the works, traffic signs and folding stands announce the speed limit and the narrowing; on short jobs it can fold away at night and return at dawn; where the hazard continues overnight the sign stays in place and is lit.
- Temporary diversion. At a closed lane, traffic signs and folding stands spell out the alternative route.
- Event traffic. Traffic signs and folding stands set up temporary parking and entry guidance for a single day.
- Emergency response. The moment the crew steps out, traffic signs and folding stands mark the closed lane.

STANDARDS AND DOCUMENT LANGUAGE

Manufactured to the order's specification in the Turkish market; the governing document is stated in writing at quotation. The reflective class of the sign face is stated in writing per the supplier's document; class names are cited only with the document. Test results and certificates are shared with the report and the document.
